

MONSON OF NEW YORK WINS LONG SKI RACE

And Is Dominion Champion
—Geo. Audette, Ottawa
Ski Club, City Champion.

Two races were combined in the ski contest held yesterday up the Gatineau, the championship of the City of Ottawa, and the Dominion championship. Rolph Monson, of the Norseman Ski Club, New York, who was second to Omtvedt in the jumping championships at Rockcliffe Park Saturday afternoon, won the open race, finishing about one minute ahead of Peter McKinnon, of the Montreal Ski Club, with George Audette, of the Ottawa Ski Club, a bang up third, barely beaten for second place by McKinnon. Frank McKinnon, Montreal Ski Club, last year's winner, was fourth. Lucien Bourgault and Tom Brown, both of the Ottawa Ski Club, finished fifth and sixth, respectively, with O. E. Sundberg, of the Cliffside, sixth.

The race was run over a course of from fifteen to sixteen miles. It began and ended at Camp Fortune, headquarters of the Ottawa Ski Club, and covered a big stretch of territory in the Gatineau Valley.

By finishing third to Monson and McKinnon, George Audette won the city championship, and put up a good performance.

It was a great race, and attracted a big crowd to Camp Fortune. Monson's time was 2 hrs. and 27 mins. The first seven to finish:
