Malcolm Hunter Trophy



The Malcolm Hunter Award recognizes the Senior Aggregate champions at the Ski Nationals. Malcolm was a 1972 Olympian and long-time volunteer and staff member with CCC. He won Canadian Championship titles at both the Junior and Senior level in 1969.

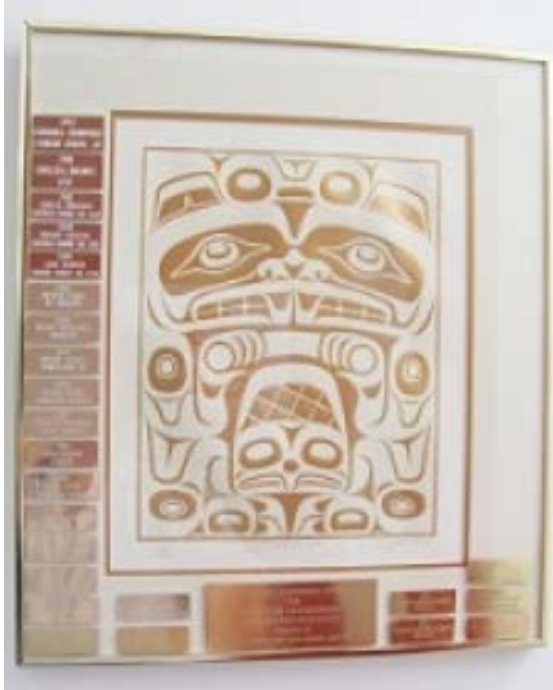
The Sofie Manarin Award



Awarded to the overall Juvenile champions.

The Sofie Manarin Award was established in 2004 in memory of Sofie Manarin, a member of the 2001 Junior NST who passed away while training as a result of a traffic accident in Sudbury. At the age of 16, Sofie has already won 13 Junior Championship medals in her short career and was the top North American women at the 2001 World Junior Championships.

Mary Anderson Award



Women's 30km.

As a resident of the northern BC community of Burns Lake, Mary Anderson was a "pioneer" coach and cross-country ski promoter. She was a tireless and unselfish worker in the sport.

Rolf Petterson Trophy



Men's 50km,

This trophy was donated by the Viking Construction Ltd. from Prince George, BC. in honour of Rolf Petterson a former National Ski Team member and Olympian for Canada.

Devlin Cup

Men's 15 km:

Originally donated by W.C. Devlin, VP of the Canadian Ski Association in 1931, the Cup is awarded annually to the winner of the 15 km men's race at the Canadian Ski Championships. The Cup, was constructed of solid silver and originally stood 15 inches high. The current version resides at the Bill Warren Training Centre and now stands almost 3 feet high and contains the names of skiers dating back to the first Canadian Championships in 1921.

The Hickory Wing Trophy



Women's 5km:

The Hickory Wing Trophy was donated by the founding members of the Hickory Wing Ski Club of Prince George, BC. It is annually awarded to the winner of the Women's 5 km event at the Canadian Cross-Country Ski Championships.

Muskoka Trophy



Jr. Girls Challenge Relay

The Muskoka Trophy was donated by the Muskoka Loppet Committee and Lembit Joselin of the Estonian Ski Club of Toronto in the late 60's. The winner of the Junior and then Challenge Girls 3 x 5 km relay at the National Championships was recognized until 2007 when the Trophy was presented to the winners of the Challenge Girls Team Sprint event.

Pepsi Cola Trophy



Jr. Boys Challenge Relay:

The Pepsi Cola trophy was introduced in 1956 at the first Canadian Junior Cross Country Ski Championships. At that time the trophy was presented to the top Junior aggregate team by the Pepsi Cola Company. In recent years the trophy has been presented to the top Junior Men's Relay team at the National Championships. In 2007 the award was first presented to the Team Sprint winners.
