

OLSEN AND LOCKEBERG JUMPED SAME DISTANCE AT THE MEET AND COULDN'T BREAK THE TIE

T. R. H. Duke and Duchess of Connaught Saw Meet.

Lockeberg Won in the Style and Distance Event—Morin the Winner in Cross Country and Intermediate Jump.

Adolph Olsen and Sigurd Lockeberg tried three times to break their tie in the standing jump at the big ski meet yesterday, but were unable to go even a single inch farther than the 91 foot mark at which they both planted their skis.

It was the most sensational event of the meet, each expert trying three times to add a little to his jump. The judges finally declared it a dead heat. For the intermediate jumpers, a style and distance jumping competition, was won out by T. J. Morin, who took down 272 points. Bill Ross got second place with 243 and "Bun" Thackery third with 230. Bill Ross made up for his loss of the style and distance event by winning the standing intermediate jump with a leap of 78 feet.

In the senior style and distance event Sigurd Lockeberg and Adolph Olsen gave the judges a merry time trying to decide which was the better on the day's showing, Lockeberg getting the decision on style, Olsen out-jumping him in distance.

In the four-mile cross-country, T. J. Morin arrived first at the finishing point, with A. D. Perney second. The time for the first arrival was 30 minutes 21 seconds, very good time for the distance. T. R. H. the Duke and Duchess of Connaught and Princess Patricia attended the jumping competitions with a party from Rideau Hall, and remained for about three-quarters of an hour. Messrs. O. B. Haycock and C. E. Mortureux acted as judges and their rulings met with popular approval.

LOCAL SKIMEN EXPECT TO WIN IN MONTREAL.

On Saturday, Feb. 21, the Ottawa Ski Club will send down a bunch of ski jumpers and cross-country runners for the big ski meet in the big town.

The cross-country team will be Adolph Olsen, Sigurd Lockeberg, Joe Morin and Hans Kihl. The distance is ten miles starting at Shawbridge. For the jumps all of the above mentioned ski men and also three or four others will go.

Secretary Morin is very enthusiastic over the prospects of the club and can see nothing but a clean-up for the Ottawa club at the big Montreal affair.
