

## Eddie Condon Wins Ski Running Title

Eddie Condon, of the Ottawa Ski Club won the Canadian Ski-running championship of Canada at Fairy Lake on Saturday afternoon, when he led a field of 26 entrants after a splendid demonstration of grit and determination. Although barely in Ottawa but a few hours following an arduous trip from Lake Placid, Condon jumped into the race and gave a fine display. His time was 1 hour, 21 minutes and 56 3/4 seconds. He was six seconds ahead of Rolf Munsen, of the Brattleboro Outing Club, who finished second. Merritt Putman, of the Toronto Ski Club, came third, slightly over four minutes behind Munsen.

It was a great race from start to finish. Condon and Munsen staged a thrilling duel the whole way, and brought salvoes of applause from the large crowd that lined the route. The course was for 12 miles, and Condon even led the trail blazers home.

### Condon's Great Form.

Ernie Hiney sent a large field away at 4 o'clock. Phil Wright, of Cliffside, was first. Condon, the winner, was a post entry, and drew position No. 30, but objection was raised, and he started seventh. After the first mile he passed all the entrants, and then shot out in front of the course markers. From that on he had to make his own course, and when the familiar white sweater of the blonde boy was seen in the distance a mighty cheer arose from the onlookers. Condon was fresh at the finish, and his performance was a remarkable one under the circumstances.

In addition to the display given by Condon, the form shown by Rolf Munsen, of Brattleboro, Merritt Putman, of Toronto, Ken Fosberry, of Ottawa, and Keith Oliver, Montreal, was excellent. Dick Reynolds and Joe McCloskey finished sixth and seventh respectively. The results in full:
