

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

At Three Rivers, 1934

THE 1934 Dominion Championships were held at Three Rivers, Quebec, by the Three Rivers Ski Club in connection with the Tercentenary of this old French-Canadian city. The Three Rivers Ski Club are to be congratulated on the way they conducted their first Dominion Tournament, and everyone was much pleased with the very complete arrangements made for the carrying out of the events and splendid entertainment given to all the visitors. A large civic reception and banquet were held at the local hotel on Saturday evening which was attended by all the notables of the city and surrounding country, and all who had the pleasure of visiting Three Rivers will always remember the delightful time they enjoyed. The judges, Messrs. S. R. Lockeberg, N. Berger, and W. T. Pickering, appointed at the annual meeting, conducted the events in their usual satisfactory way.

A slim youth of 16 years, Percy "Punch" Bott, of the Montreal Ski Club, on the Cap aux Corneilles hill of the Three Rivers Ski Club defeated an international field and captured the ski jumping championship of Canada. Tired by a 36-hour drive from Lake Placid, N.Y., Ambrose C. Lund of the St. Paul, Minn., Ski Club, defended his title, but fell on his first jump.

Halvor Heggveit, lanky racer of the Ottawa Ski Club, won the initial event of the Dominion Ski Championships over an 11-mile course of difficult country at Shawinigan Falls, Que., to carry off the cross-country honors. Erkki Pentilla, of the Montreal Ski Club was not on hand to defend his championship, as he has returned to his native Finland.

Karl Baadsvik, of the Vikings Ski Club, Montreal, by virtue of being second in the jumping and eighth in the cross-country, once again annexed the combined championship which he first won last year.

The slalom, which has been an unofficial event of the Dominion meet for the past two years, was not held owing to lack of time.

Bott's victory marked a new chapter in Canadian ski-ing as he is the youngest skier to hold the Dominion jumping title. While only 16 years of age, young Bott has been jumping for half that time, and for the last six years on senior jumps. A class "A" jumper at 12, Punch holds the St. Maurice Valley jumping championship and was runner up in the Ontario meet three weeks before at Toronto. He is also the scholastic champion of Montreal.

On his first jump, Bott rushed through the air and landed 121 feet down the steep hill. The next time he sped down the chute at high speed, the fast snow greatly adding to his momentum, and scored 130 feet. His good style added many points, bringing his total up to 221.90. Punch won the Waagen Bowl, emblematic of the championship and also the Three Rivers Tercentenary Cup.

Karl Baadsvik who was second last year in addition to being the 1933 Ontario and Quebec titleholder, leaped 120 feet on his first attempt and 125 feet on his second, to gather a total of 220.20 points.

One of the outstanding features of the jumping was the smart showing of Stanley Dufresne, of the Three Rivers Ski Club. The short, stocky 18-year-old soared 126 feet on his first jump and then 124 feet. With only three years experience behind him, Dufresne amassed a total of 217.90 points, only .30 behind Baadsvik of the Vikings Ski Club.

K. Baadsvik won his great honours in the combined event by second place in the jumping and eighth in the langlauf. Right behind him was W. G. "Bud" Clark, racing in the colors of the St. Patrick's College, Ottawa. Clark was third in the cross-country and eighteenth in the jumping. He was closely pressed by Art Gravel of the Montreal Ski Club who was sixth in the langlauf and eighth in the jumping. Howard Bagguley was third and Ole Bakkellund fourth.
