

# COMPETITIONS

## *Eighteenth Annual C. A. S. A. Championships*

**L**EAPING from the towering jump into a blinding snowstorm, Jim Riddell of the Ski Club of Montreal won the Canadian Ski Jumping Championship at the Dominion Ski Meet at Ottawa, February 26-27, with a point total of 210.8.

The Montreal ace soared 128 feet on his first jump and 110 on the second. He displayed superb form on both jumps despite a howling blizzard that swept over the Gatineau Hills' camp 20 miles north of Ottawa as the second and final day of the meet concluded.

K. Lovgren of Temiskaming placed second with a point total of 208.5. His first jump was 130 feet and his second 108. Bob Johannsen of McGill Ski Club, Montreal, was third, netting a point total of 202.6 following two jumps of 130 and 90 feet.

Johannsen made the best individual showing for the four events of the tournament. He won the downhill race and placed fifth in the cross-country. In the slalom which preceded the jumping he was eighth. These performances gave him the combined jumping and cross-country title by a wide margin and the closed combined downhill and slalom crown. He was third in the open division for combined downhill and slalom.

Bud Clark of Norland Ski Club, Ottawa, won the open combined slalom and downhill title with a score of 218 points. He placed second in the slalom with a time of 1-18.1, three seconds behind Karl Ringer of Germany. In the downhill the Ottawa youth was third behind the Champion Johannsen and Peter Vodja of Switzerland.

Johannsen showed spectacular speed in winning the downhill in 1-22; Vodja was second in 1-23.2 and Clark of Ottawa third in 1-24.04. Louis Cochand of Montreal, rated No. 1 Canadian downhill racer last year ran into difficulty on the downhill run and finished in eighth place.

The Canadian Cross-country Championship was won by Bruce Heggtveit, of Ottawa Ski Club. He finished the 11-mile run in 1 hour, 12 minutes and 4 seconds. A. E. Myll, of Sudbury Ski Club, was only a second behind the Ottawa youth. Lauri Tulkku, also of Sudbury Ski Club, finished third in 1 hour, 12 minutes and 9 seconds.

Ringer, of Germany, swooped down the slalom run in 1 minute and 15 seconds to win that title. Bud Clark, of Ottawa Ski Club was second in 1-18.1 and Jim Houghton, of McGill Ski Club, Montreal, third in 1-22.

The Ottawa Ski Club, sponsors of the meet, with their years of experience behind them had a fine working organization and all the events were well handled. Unfortunately the Downhill course was not long enough to be a fitting or fair test for a Dominion Championship, but this was due to terrain limitations. Sigurd Lockeberg as usual was everywhere and working every minute to make the meeting the great success it was. The banquet Saturday evening at the Chateau Laurier was enjoyed by every one, and the German ski team proved themselves great dancers, singers, yodelers, and all round good fellows. It will go down in history as one of the most successful and enjoyable C.A.S.A. tournaments.
