

Yukon Martha tops cross-country field

PENTETANGUISHENE — (CP)—The Ladies's six-kilometre race terminated all cross-country events at the Canadian Nordic ski championships.

The Canadian cross-country champ in the Ladies' Division is Martha Benjamin, of the Yukon's Whitehorse Ski Club, who did the course in 43.29. Runner-up was Anni Saari of the Sampo Athletic Club of Sudbury with a time of 45.03. Third-place honors went to Ula Jamsa of the Reitans Ski Club, of Fort William, Ont. Her time was 45.32. There were nine women in the event.

Cloudy skies and 29-degree weather prevailed during the

race—a much-welcome change from earlier predictions of mild weather.

Antero Rauhanen, who won the 30-kilometre cross-country event on Thursday, took the 15-kilometre race Saturday and was presented for the fifth time with the special trophy for winning both races, and received a gold medal from the president of the Canadian Amateur Ski Association, Rae Grinnell.

Rauhanen's time for the 30-kilometre run was 1.51.21. Second in that race was Clarence Servold of the Foothills Nordic Ski Club of Calgary, who ran it in 1.51.37. He had been favored in the event. Third was Kauko Riihiahho of Sudbury's Sampo Club with a time of 1.52.55. He also placed second in the 15-kilometre run.

Don MacLeod of Ottawa had waxing problems, and failed to finish near the top.
